The caregivers were overwhelmed with joy as they were concerned that she might not be able to walk because she was already two years old.

Today she is 15 years old and progressing well in school for children with special educational needs. In 2018 Ellis qualified to take part in a Special Education School Athletic challenge. She had the privilege to travel to Bloemfontein in October 2018. She finished 31st in her category for long distance running.
